





THE BIG WAR AT SEA




The Destroyer, a wooden pirate ship, set sail on July 16, 1822, from the Island of Skulls in the Atlantic Ocean.

The two ships lined themselves up to blow their cannons. It got quiet, and then the canons fired loud and struck each other's ships.


Sometimes cannons will blow up if they

Captain Davey's crew started to fight, but then Captain Davey started attacking his own crew, so they turned against him.




The pirates who continued fighting were overcome and killed, but the pirates who surrendered got some lashes.
