Lance got scared and pushed him in the Great River of Milk.

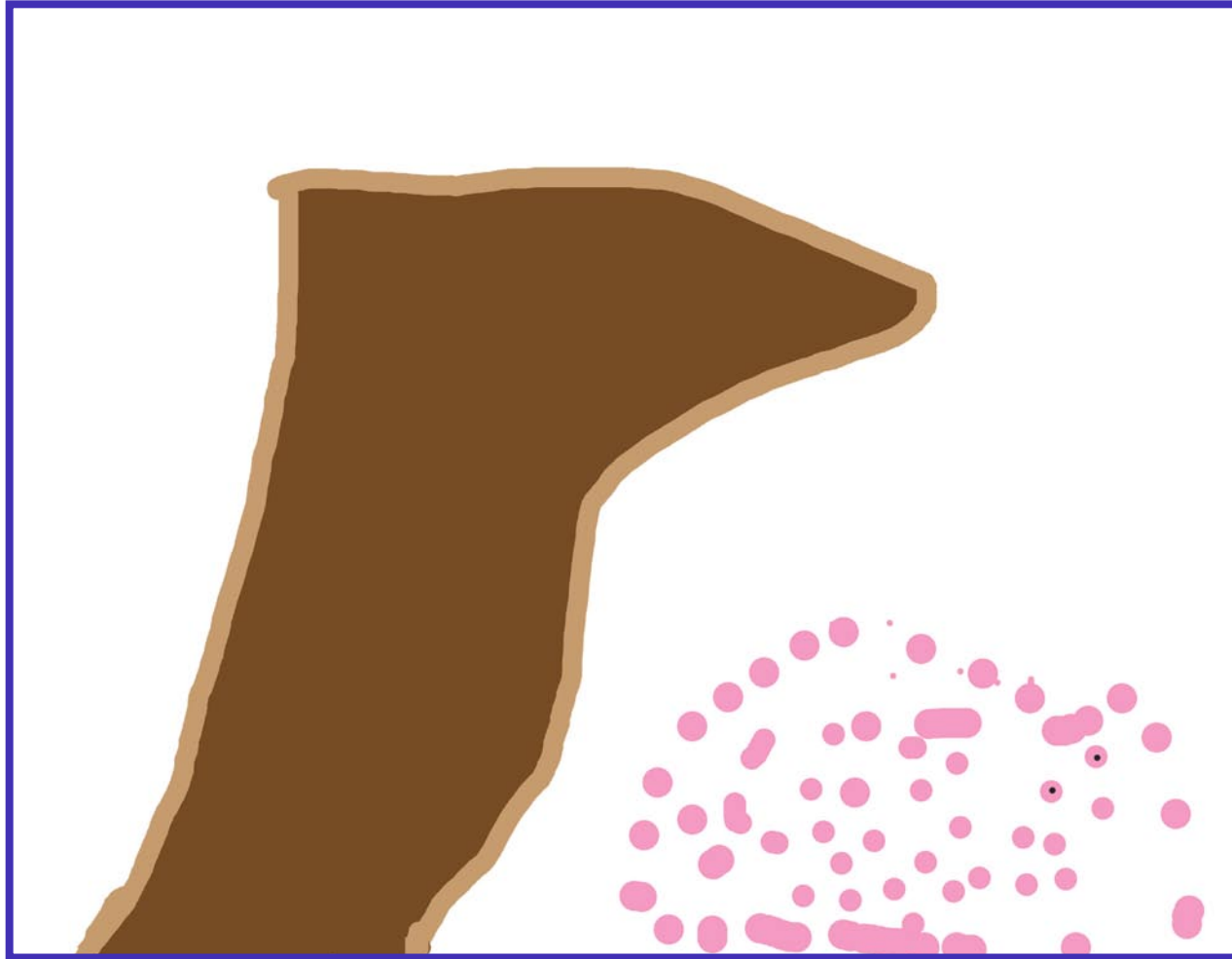




After awhile a cookie fishing boat came along and saw the cookie floating and pulled him out of the milk and brought him back to Liz and Lance.
