They looked everywhere to find her mother they found very pretty women that could have been the Queen of England, but she kept saying "no that is not my mother!"






Then all of a sudden this old lady came walking up the street with dirty hair, chipped nails, and ragged clothes.



The girl saw that woman and shouted, "Mother!" the mother embraced her and the little girl was happy.




The Lord and Lady asked, "You said she was the most beautiful woman in the whole world!?"
