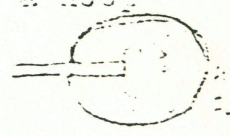


Mrs. Grant

clapper-~~shagik!apit~~ Perhaps made of spruce. A little stick was inserted at the handle end of the crevice and tied in place with sinew.

flute-~~hih!no'it~~ ~~There was a bevelled edge for the blow hole. The flute was somewhat longer than the one Tintin made, and bigger around. There were four stops but they were on one side and not in a line with the mouth hole. The flute was held to the left.~~

drum -name forgotten. It was made by stretching a deer skin on a hoop and sewing it on the under side. It was beaten with a stick which had a ball on the end of it made by stuffing shavings into a deer hide and tying it on to the end. The shavings were taken from arrows when they were worked down. The drum had a handle which was called ha' ~~amail~~, the l having almost the sound of a d.



There was no hollow log drum.

There was no stringed instrument that Mrs. Grant can recall.

There were no shell rattles.

Whistle-~~hih!no'it~~ This was the single type. There were no double whistles. The whistle was made of the quill end of the chicken hawk ~~feather~~.
